BUT YOU STILL HAVE TO APPLY TO HAVE AN OFFENDING HUB SHIFTED!

-some ideas from SMAG

 Base Your Request for a change of site on the Framework because IF your proposal does not follow the key rules laid out in the updated framework, your chances of success are LOW (unless there's a clearly exceptional reason.)

-the CEC now knows they have to listen

- A Focus on Resident Amenity is one of your strongest arguments. Demonstrate how the bin hub negatively affects:
 - Noise levels
 - Odours
 - Privacy (e.g. right outside a window)
 - Outlook/view from the property

This is the best "break clause" in the CEC's otherwise strict criteria—use it wisely!

-put in some detail

- Measure and Map the Details so you can back your case with evidence:
 - Measure distance to junctions (must be at least 10m).
 - Ensure it is not on a pavement.
 - Check walking distance to hub is less than 120m.
 - Identify if the site is on a narrow road or has poor lines of sight.
 - Note any accident history within 25m.
 - Describe if there is no safe space to stand when using the bins (needs 1.5m hard-standing or grass).

4. Hospitality or Food Shop Proximity should be pointed out as these locations are NOT supposed to have bin hubs beside them.

-remember the CEC has a job to do!

- Be Strategic, Not Just Emotional and avoid simply saying "we don't like it."Explain how the location violates or poorly fits the new framework.
 - Suggest a better alternative location if possible.
 - Mention if fly-tipping and has become a nuisance.
- Involve your Councillor write, email, phone etc. Use media eg mention them in a letter to the local paper. Get together with SMAG.

- -be professional in your approach
- 7. Submit a Clear, Written Request, for example using a SMAG template Make your case in writing and include:
 - Photos of the current bin hub
 - A sketch/map if useful
 - Bullet points matching framework criteria
 - Resident feedback or petition signatures (if possible)

You need a change......

So, you have to explain to the CEC why that is reasonable.
